


Year One Summer Term Week 8

Topic: Enchanted Woodlands



We are looking forward to our trip to Hatchlands Park on Friday. Please remember that all children will need a sun hat and named water bottle.



English



This week we are continuing to delve into the wonderful world of Enchanted Woodlands and *Little Red Riding Hood*.

We have acted out the story and written it ourselves using Pie Corbett's Talk for Write technique. We will now be writing our own version of the story. In this creative writing piece the children will be changing the main character to themselves, changing the animal and any other bits that they wish to, they will have creative license.

As the children are approaching Year 2 we will expect to be seeing capital letters in the correct places, full stops and spaces between words consistently being used throughout their writing. In Phonics we will be continuing to practise reading real and pseudo words. We practise pseudo words so that we can see that children know how to decode words even if they don't make sense.

Maths



This week we will be focussing on measurement. This is the third time the children will be looking at measurement within our spiral curriculum. We will be reviewing length, width, volume, capacity and weight. The children will use the basic instruments to measure these and they will write amounts with the units to demonstrate their knowledge. Children will also add amounts together to create new amounts. If you are doing any cooking or building at home and the children don't already do so, please encourage them to read the measurements for you.

Foundation Subjects



During RE we will be learning about places that are important to Hindus. In P.S.H.E. will be thinking about how we keep ourselves clean and why it is important. The skills that we will be developing in PE are to perform a range of throws, move our bodies in different shapes strengthening our control and coordination. The children will continue to learn P.E. core skills such as, coordination and fluency. In I.C.T. the children will continue to consider what being safe online means where the focus will be about personal information. In Geography the children will learn to identify human and physical features of our environment and begin to identify and describe where places are through the use of simple maps. The children will be finishing their clay woodland animals in Art. In Music children will be using percussion instruments to create animal sounds. They will continue to learn new songs to build up their repertoire.
