





# Year 2 Curriculum Letter Autumn 2020 First Half Term Weeks 6 and 7



## Beat Band Boogie!

<b>Weeks 4 &amp; 5 Innovate</b>	
<p><b>Innovate Music</b></p>  <p><b>PHSCE</b></p> 	<p>The children will use their learning experiences so far this term to form their own marching bands. They will co-operate in small groups to decide which instruments they will use and the actions their band will add to their music.</p> <p>As a group, they will plan their composition along with a way to record their ideas in a written form. They will elaborate on their reasoning for the choices they have made in relation to the instruments and musical elements selected for their composition. They will have the opportunity to rehearse their actions and music, reflecting on the outcome and adapting as needed.</p>
<p><b>English</b></p>  	<p>The children will further explore the story of The Bear and the Piano. They will use their story maps to retell the story in their own words. They will apply their phonic knowledge to build both familiar and new words. They will form clear sentences using one conjunction to extend their simple sentences.</p>  <p>The children will also explore the story Starry-Eyed Stan. As they read this story they will focus on reading and spelling common exception words as well as identifying conjunctions in the story.</p> <p>The children will participate in daily phonic sessions and use their phonic skills to spell new words.</p>
<p><b>Maths</b></p> 	<p>Numbers – Addition and Subtraction</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>34 + 30 = 64</b></p>  <p>The children will be adding and subtracting both 1s and 10s with manipulatives and mentally. They will recall numbers one more or less and ten more or less than a given number. The children will consider the patterns created and the location of numbers on the 100 square. They will record in a written form, adding 1s or 10s to one, two and three digit numbers.</p>
<p><b>Physical Education</b></p> 	<p>The children will support each other with suggestions of how to improve their balance. They will also take part in the Daily Mile to develop their fitness and stamina.</p> <p>The children will listen to and explore The Carnival of the Animals, creating movements to match each part of the music. They will use their bodies to reflect the tempo, pulse or beat of the music.</p>
<p><b>Religious Education</b></p> 	<p>The children will learn about the festival of Sukkot and how it is celebrated by the Jewish Community. They will compare the Christian festival of Harvest with the Jewish festival of Sukkot, identifying similarities and differences.</p>

<p><b>Personal, Social, Health and Citizenship Education (PSHCE)</b></p> 	<p>The children will explore the 1-5 scale to help them talk about their emotions. They will talk about ways to calm themselves down, such as reading a book or drawing a picture.</p> <p>The children will talk about ways to resolve disagreements that may happen at home and school. They will think about considering other people's points of views when trying to find a solution.</p>
<p><b>Wanted!</b></p> 	<p>Thank you to those families who have already sent these items into school. We use resources carefully but do use lots of the things listed below.
