

Nursery Curriculum Letter Friday 13th October Autumn 2023

This week we have enjoyed the lovely weather and spent lots of time outside. We have introduced balance bikes and we have been practising putting helmets on to keep us safe. We have also looked at the world map and added our photos to show where our families come from.

Curriculum 🥳	We will find out what 'harvest' means and learn about different types of food which might be harvested.
Literacy Communication and Language	We will continue to learn a core selection of Nursery Rhymes and use sign language or props when we sing them. We will read a selection of harvest inspired books such as The Little Red Hen and The Enormous Turnip.
Maths	We will learn how to count a small group of objects, carefully making sure we touch or move each object so we know we have counted it. We can practise maths anywhere and everywhere. On the way to school you could try counting trees or birds or red front doors or busesin fact anything that interests your child.
Physical Development	<u>Development of ongoing skills such as:</u> Go up steps & stairs, or climb up apparatus, using alternate feet Use one handed tools & equipment, e.g. making snips in paper with scissors Use a comfortable grip with good control when holding pens and pencils Continue to develop their movement, balancing, riding (scooters, trikes & bikes) & ball skills.

Reminders Reminders!	Please make sure that your child has a spare clothes bag on their peg and make sure everything is named, we can not repatriate items which are not named. Remember we also need: a named hat and a named pair of wellies which will stay at school.

Learning at home




