
Engage

Art Music DT

We will be starting our Christmas play rehearsals and focusing on performance art. Each child will be getting a part in the play: The Very Hopeless Camels. Please ask your child which part they will have. We will then be rehearsing as a year group and in smaller groups. In Music we will be practising the songs from the play, please ask your child to sing our songs to you.










In D.T. we will be creating a gift that your child will be bringing home for you (it will be a surprise!). We will be discussing the design process and reminding the children that products that we design and create serve a purpose.

English



Over the next two weeks in English the children will be using all the knowledge they have learned about animals to write their own non-fiction books. First they will create a plan by drawing and labelling the animals that they will be writing about. They will then draw and label the animals' habitat. We will encourage the children to use adjectives in their writing, for example: *sharp claws*. When the children begin writing their nonfiction animal books we will focus on capital letters, writing on the line and using full stops to demarcate sentences.



Please remember to read with your child each night and record the name of the book in your child's blue communication book.

Maths



Next week we will be exploring time and focusing on o'clock and half past. We will be learning how to make these times on our clocks and learning how to draw the hands of a clock to show different times. The following week we will be consolidating all that we have learnt so far this term. This will cover money, shape and time. With money, the children will be recognising and labelling coins. When we cover 2D and 3D shapes we will be exploring them by recognising, naming and discussing their properties.



Physical Education



Over the next two weeks our P.E focus will be developing cardio fitness. We will complete regular exercises to develop stamina.



Over the next two weeks R.E. will be linked to English where we will be **Religious Education** learning about and writing the nativity story and discussing why it is important to Christians. We will learn about the main characters in the Christmas story and why they are important figures in Christian history. In R.H.E. we will be talking about performance and what confidence means. We will talk Relationship and about speaking and singing with loud, clear voices. We will also be talking about what **Health Education** rehearsing for a performance entails and why all children need to listen and show respect (R.H.E) for others while they are practising their part. Please make sure all hats, scarves, gloves, coats and jumpers are named. Wanted! Please make sure your child has a transparent, named water bottle at school every day.
