

Year 2 Curriculum Letter Spring 2024 Second Half-Term, Week 8



Muck, Mess and Mixtures

Week 8 Develop A	Art Focus
Develop Art	This week the children will explore a range of techniques using clay, drawing with charcoal and printing. Using the clay they will learn how to make a pinch pot and a coil pot. Exploring the different effects that can be created with charcoal will deepen their understanding of drawing. They will use paint to explore the technique of printing. The children will learn about masterpieces created by famous artists (Barbara Hepworth, Alma Thomas and L. S. Lowry) who used these techniques in their art.
English	The children will continue exploring the story Izzy Gizmo, sequencing the events in order. They will write a letter to Izzy telling her about the scientific experiments that they have taken part in at school. They will also use the story to write a character description of Izzy.
Maths	Mental Maths – The children will practise reading numbers with 2 or 3 digits, thinking about the value of each digit. They will use their knowledge of the value of each digit to compare numbers using the inequality signs. Shapes – The children will continue to explore the properties of 3D shapes. They will explore making repeating patterns with both 2D and 3D shapes. The children will use resources such as construction kits to make 3D shapes.
Physical Education	The children will learn about the game of Rugby. They will play games to develop the skills needed to play tag rugby. They will continue to develop their gross motor skills by completing a range of control and agility challenges with equipment outside. They will challenge themselves to see how many times in the week they can complete the outside Movement Challenge.
Earth Awareness	The children will continue to explore trees and how to correctly identify and name them. The children will look closely at the bark and leaves to identify the trees.
Religious Education	The children will continue to learn about The Torah and the five stories it refers to. They will then compare it to The Old Testament in a Christian Bible. They will also
