Week 11 Express	
<p>Express Art</p>  <p>Science</p>  <p>Geography</p> 	<p>The children will co-operate as a year group to finalise the construction of their Art Gallery. Each child will ensure their masterpiece is appropriately displayed with a short description. The children will then welcome their families, friends and children from other classes to the Art Gallery. They will explain the new techniques they have learned over the half term. Finally they will review their learning this half term and identify the investigative skills they have developed.</p> <p>The children will also be taking part in International Week. They will travel around the school to 'visit' different countries. They will locate where the countries are in the world and will learn about the people, the food and the culture.</p>  
<p>English</p> 	<p>The children will review their knowledge of the Easter story, retelling the main events in order. They will use their editing skills to edit and improve their learning. The children will reflect on their learning over the half term and write about it, highlighting some elements they enjoyed the most.</p> 
<p>Maths</p> 	<p>Mental Maths – The children will recall their addition and subtraction skills, adding 2-digit and 1-digit numbers and multiples of 10.</p> <p>Measures – The children will explore measurement, particularly length or height. They will measure objects and record their findings. The children will explore the units of millimetres (mm), centimetres (cm) and metres (m) and the relationship between them. They will use their understanding of number to reason about measurements and solve problems.</p>
<p>Physical Education</p> 	<p>The children will continue to develop the skills they need to play the game of Rugby. They will use the skills they have developed to play tag rugby passing and throwing the ball to their team without their tag being caught.</p> <p>They will continue to develop their gross motor skills by completing a range of control and agility challenges with equipment outside. They will challenge themselves to see how many times in the week they can complete the outside Movement Challenge.</p>
<p>Religious Education</p> 	<p>The children will review their knowledge of the Easter story and what it means to the Christian Community. They will sequence the events in the Easter story and retell the story in their own words.</p>
<p>R.H.E. (Relationship & Health Education)</p>	<p>The children will discuss which foods they choose to eat and how this gives their body energy. They will think about how it is important to eat a healthy diet as part of everyday life. The children</p> 

	<p>will talk about which foods are nutritious for their bodies and why it is important to eat a variety of foods.</p>
<p>Music</p> 	<p>The children will continue to learn a range of songs and practise singing with a piano accompaniment. The children will listen to and appreciate styles of music from countries around the world. They will identify similarities and differences between the styles of music.</p>
