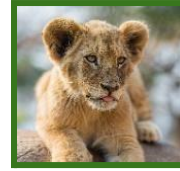
Spring

Curriculum



For international week we will be focusing on Australia in Nursery. We will also take 'flights' to visit some other countries in the Reception classrooms including India, Japan and South Africa.

Literacy Communication and Language



We will read lots of books set in Australia or including Australian animals.

Phonics



We will read some of the phonics books online and make up stories to match the pictures.



Maths



We will look at patterns, and repeating patterns and try to incorporate patterns in Easter egg designs.

Physical Development



Development of ongoing skills such as:

- Match their developing physical skills to tasks and activities in the setting. E.g. they decide whether to crawl, walk or run across a plank, depending on its length & width
- Skip, hop, stand on one leg & hold a pose for a game like musical statues
- Remember sequences and patterns of movements which are related to music and rhythm
- Be increasingly independent in meeting their own care needs e.g. brushing teeth, using the toilet, washing & drying their hands thoroughly
- Start to eat independently and learning how to use a knife & fork
