Curriculum



We will be finding out about different jobs grown ups might do.

Literacy Communication and Language



We will find out about what different jobs involve such as police, nurse, postman, shop worker, taxi driver.

Phonics



We will keep practising **s a t p i n m d** and learn how to hear, say and write **g & o**

Maths



We will continue to work with 3D shapes spheres, cubes, cuboids, cylinders and cones and look at comparing sizes, weights and finding everyday objects which are the same shape.

Physical Development



Development of ongoing skills such as:

Start taking part in some group activities which they make up themselves, or in teams
Choose the right resources to carry out their own plan. E.g. choosing a spade to enlarge a small hole they dug with a trowel

Collaborate with others to manage large items, such as moving a long plank safely, carrying large hollow blocks

Make healthy choices about food, drink, activity & tooth brushing
