Curriculum



We will be finding out about and naming parts of our bodies, focusing on how we can keep healthy. We will also name parts of animal bodies and investigate how human bodies differ from animal bodies.

Literacy Communication and Language

We will revise 2D shapes and learn the names of 3D shapes. We will also see if we can spot 2D shapes on the 3D shapes.

Physical Development

Choose the right resources to carry out their own plan. E.g. choosing a spade to enlarge a small hole they dug with a trowel

Collaborate with others to manage large items, such as moving a long plank safely, carrying large hollow blocks

Wet weather kit please ensure your child still has a wet weather kit at school, we never know what the weather will be like!

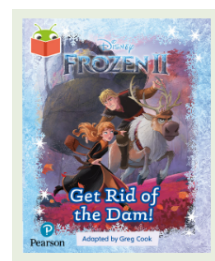
Learning at home
